
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BEST PRACTICE -1: Cloth Distribution

- 1. <u>**TitleofthePractice**</u>:Distribution of clothes to underprivileged children of the neighboring areas.
- 2. <u>Objectives of the Practice</u>: Toreach out to the economically marginalized sections of the society, fulfillour social commitment towards eradicating poverty and share hope and joy for all segments of the population in a festive city.
- 3. <u>The Context</u>: Manyvulnerable children of impoverished families/daily wage earners livinginclose vicinity of our institution are deprived of their basic human amenities like food and clothing. Our institution hopes to cater to their basic needsproviding them with new clothes each year before the Durga Puja and usher positivity and warmth before the festive season.
- 4. Practice: The NSS, IQAC and Student's Council of our college collaborate to distribute new clothes to around 100 children every year. This practice was initiated by the Student's Council and our Principal's Office, to fulfill the social and moral responsibility of the institution. The active cooperation and financial contribution of all teaching and nonteaching staff cannot be understated.Slips are distributed to the underprivileged families of the locality, and their children are invited to receive new clothes in the college. All our teaching and non-teaching staff are enthusiastically involved and dedicated in the entire process. The Principal initiates the practice by distributing the new clothesas well as dry food.He is followed by the staff, NSS and Student Council members who continue the practice. The children likewise participate in the infectious positive vibe of the event with beaming faces, and their eagerness rightly heralds our puja festivities. During the initial years, the event was conducted inside the college classroom (R. 209). However, it was shifted to the front premises of the "UddalakBhavan" after the latter was constructed. The "bastradaan" practice is the right build up to the



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spiritual ethosof the Durga puja which celebrates the spirit of togetherness and harmony.

- 5. **Evidence of success:**Ever since its inception, this practice has helped connect the institution with the demographic of the location. The latter has responded positively to the institution's altruistic commitment, especially after the economic uncertainty and rising financial crisis in the post-pandemic years. The hopeful and satisfiedlooks of the children receiving new clothes, which enables them to partake of the joyous warmth of an illuminated festive city, is also evidence of the success of our community drive. In addition, our students learn the necessity of empathy and engaging in pro-social behavior which helps to improve their social relationships, and inspires them for future philanthropic causes.
- 6. <u>Problems Encountered and Resources Required</u>:Due to our limited resources, many children cannot avail the facility. Weintend to purchase more clothes in the coming yearsas required to extend our cause.

2. The context that required the institution of the practice: Our Institute practiced to help those people who are in urgent need of blood. The College made publicity through Central Blood Bank, Students Health Home, Students, Staff, Ex-students, parents and other well-wishers of the institution to approach the institute for voluntary blood donation in needy time. 
